CII Compliance

Under Resolution MEPC.328(76), effective from 1 November 2022, all cargo and cruise ships ≥ 5000 GT must comply with new MARPOL Annex VI requirements on operational Carbon Intensity Indicator (CII) and enhanced Ship Energy Efficiency Management Plan (SEEMP). The CII, measured in **grams of CO₂ per deadweight-nautical mile**, determines a ship's **annual efficiency rating** from A (best) to E (worst).

Based on IMO DCS data, ships must annually calculate, report, and verify their attained CII against required baselines, which become stricter each year. Correction factors and voyage adjustments are applied as per MEPC.355(78) to ensure fair CII assessments across ship types and trades. Vessels rated D for 3 years or E for 1 year must submit amended SEEMP III with Corrective Action Plan.
